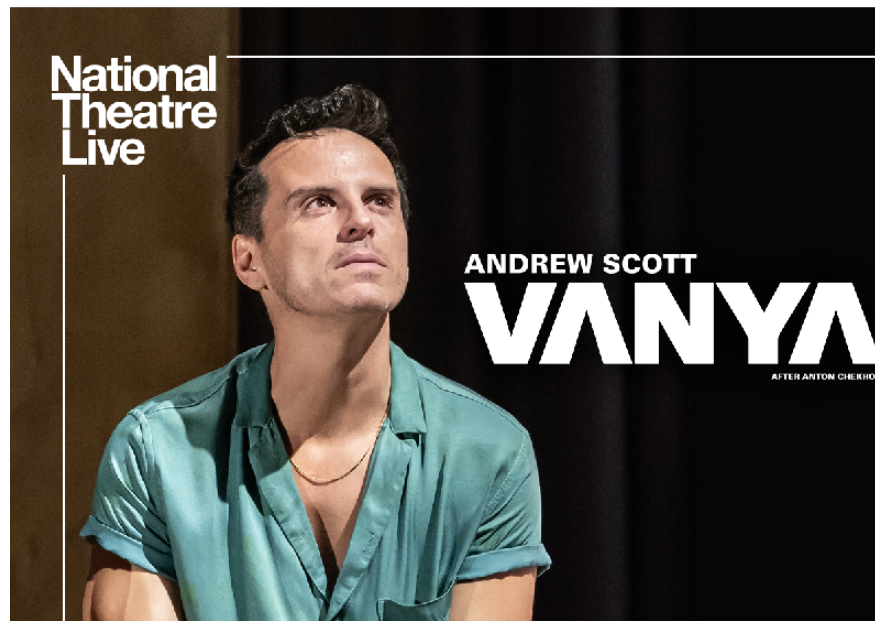

'BRIDGING THE TAMAR' - GUIDED TOUR

Come and join a guided tour to learn about the history and heritage of the Tamar Estuary's iconic bridges, the 20th century Tamar Bridge and Isambard Kingdom Brunel's 19th century Royal Albert Bridge. It includes a guided tour onto the Tamar Bridge, stopping off at points of interest and appreciating the views over the River Tamar and its companion the Royal Albert Bridge.

Accessibility: Walking the bridge is mostly fairly level, but around a kilometre 5/8 mile there and back. Access to the Visitor Centre is accessed by three flights of stairs with 12 steps, 6 steps and 6 steps from the bottom, or there is an accessible lift which brings you up to the lobby.

There is not a café at the Visitor Centre, but there is The Ferry House Inn on the Waterfront at Saltash Passage (Levon Bank). They serve food between 11am and 4pm and parking is on the street only. Tables can be booked at [The Ferry House Inn | England](#). There are many establishments in Saltash that would also serve lunch.
